Thought of the Week

שירו לדי' שיר חדש תהלתו בקהל חסידים.
 The holy Noam Elimelech ז"ל says that it seems that when a Jew prays for a sick person and he is healed, he actually changes something that Hashem did. One can only reply to this assumption that from Hashem no evil ever comes. But when a Jew sins, he loses contact with the Creator, and hence difficulties arise. When a Jew prays for him, the person is saved from the difficulties. But many times, there is a **קטרוג** towards the person and prayer does not help. Therefore, we must associate ourselves with "תהילה," which is the act of thanking the Creator of the world, through the thanking it radiates such a bright light that the **מקטריגים** have no power to control. Therefore, it is written **שיר חדש תהלתו בקהל חסידים**, which means that the thanking of a Jew creates a new song, a new prayer, over which the **מקטריגים** have no power to control.
